



RULES OF SUSTAINABLE FISHING

- 1) Actively participate in various Regional Fishery Organizations and/or scientific commissions and collaborate in research projects in order to increase knowledge about the state of marine resources.
- 2) Comply with the protocol of liberating susceptible species and the code of good practices. Additionally implement technological measures in order to increase selectivity in the art of fishing.
- 3) All FADs deployed by PEVASA vessels are non-entangling.
- 4) Commitment of total coverage for observers, humans and electronics, for all tides.
- 5) Classify fish from FADs and free schools and ensure that they can be tracked in accordance with the internal certification procedure.
- 6) The practice of *finning*, or cutting off shark fins is strictly prohibited.
- 7) All captured tunas must be kept on board, according to full retention tuna policy.
- 8) Facilitate by-catch species landing in ports.
- 9) Reduce the fleet's emissions and carbon footprint as much as possible.
- 10) Adequately manage the selective collection of waste generated on-board and provide removal and treatment services in ports.
